NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA

All schools are required to collect information about the numbers of students that they provide adjustments to under the Disability Discrimination Act (1992) and Disability Standards of Education (2005). From 2018, this data will be used as the basis for national funding.

The NCCD involves the collection of;

- the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students
- the level of adjustment provided to students
- student's type of disability if known

Under the model, the definition of disability is broad and includes learning difficulties, health and mental health conditions.

If your child is identified for inclusion in the Collection, the required information will be included in this year's data collection.

PASTORAL SUPPORT WORKER

Dear Families,

Ever since I was a child, I have been a proponent of focussing on positive things, filling my brain and my heart with good stuff. Then, when things are tough, I have a lot of positive thoughts and emotions to get me through. I like to describe it to children this way:

Assume you have two glasses. One is filled to the brim with clean healthy water, the other is filled with gross sloppy dog poo. When the glasses get bumped, the stuff inside is going to get spilled. Humans are the same, when we get rattled, what is inside is going to come out. So I encourage children and adults to focus on positive things.

It turns out neuroscience supports this idea. We now know through brain studies that an optimistic attitude improves well-being. The wonderful news is that an optimistic attitude can be learned. We can teach this to our children!

Psychology Today notes:

Are you one of those people who notices the bad stuff like when someone cuts you off in traffic or your food doesn't taste quite as good as you wanted it too? Then you likely have trained your brain to focus on the negative, and your brain has gotten really good at it. It can be really challenging to undo this training. So instead, train your brain to be even better at focusing on the positive.

You may be able to increase your positivity just by memorizing lists of positive words? That's right. It's because when you force your brain to use positive words frequently, you make these words (and their basic meaning) more accessible, more connected, and more easily activated in your brain. So when you go to retrieve a word or idea from your memory, positive ones can come to the top more easily.

So there you have it. Science says to think positively! Focus on the good stuff. Here is a link to some positivity games that you might like to try.
