2019 LITERACY AGREEMENT

Recently staff at Belair have been reviewing and updating our school 'Literacy Agreement'. I am pleased to say our 2019 Literacy Agreement is now in full operation and providing a framework for continuity of learning from reception to year 7. A copy of our 2019 Literacy Agreement is accompanying this bulletin.

The key elements of the literacy agreement include:

- How we work together as active members of a learning community
- How we deliver high quality teaching and learning
- Our assessment and reporting practices
- Our shared teaching approaches from reception to year 7
- How information is shared
- Our monitoring and intervention procedures

In coming newsletters and bulletins I will be sharing more information around each of our shared teaching approaches from reception to year 7, which include:

- R-2 Jolly Phonics with extension students using Words Their Way
- o Year 3-7 Words Their Way spelling
- o R-2 Jolly Grammar
- o R-7 CAFE and Daily 5
- R-7 Brightpath
- R-7 Running Records monitored to level 30
- Year 3-7 Lexile trial

To support the teaching of synthetic phonics from reception to year 2, this term, staff have undertaken refresher training in the Jolly Phonics program. Phonics refers to the relationship between individual sounds (phonemes) and the letters that represent them (graphemes). A phoneme can be represented by 1, 2, 3 or even 4 letters. The term 'synthetic' refers to the process of blending individual sounds together. Research has demonstrated synthetic phonics instruction is more effective and more efficient than other forms. We use Jolly Phonics as our synthetic phonics program here at Belair for all students from reception to year 2. As learned phonics is considered a constrained skill, it is expected that most students will have developed this skill set within the first few years of school.
