Brightpath

This term I would like to put the spot light on Brightpath, an innovative writing assessment tool that we have been using since 2019 to:

- develop teachers' assessment and moderation skills
- differentiate learning for students by providing next step teaching points in writing based on their assessment
- measure student progress over time

Our students are making excellent progress in writing and this is something for us to celebrate. In future newsletters, bulletins and Education Committee meetings, I will provide snapshots of the data we are gathering which demonstrates the excellent levels of progress and achievement of our students.

On Monday teachers and school service officers participated in a day of training and development aligned to the goals of our school Site Improvement Plan. The morning was dedicated to exploring improved ways to provide challenging tasks and problem solving in mathematics. Between morning tea and lunchtime staff worked on our IB 'Approaches to Learning' scope and sequence. The afternoon was spent analysing whole school, year level, class and individual student growth data gathered from our work across the school through the Brightpath writing initiative.

PASTORAL SUPPORT WORKER

Dear Belair Families,

It's yet another term with an unusual start. I wasn't expecting a giant generator smack in the middle of the grounds. Never a dull moment at Belair Primary School. How amazing are the students and staff at Belair for continuing to make things work! Somehow we all just get on with it.

Since we are mid-way through the year, I thought it would be a good time to remind everyone of my role at the school. Here is a summary of the various aspects of my role:

- Role Modelling and Mentoring. Be a role model in the community and assist students to develop supportive relationships with other students and adults.
- Social and Emotional Support. Provide a pastoral presence to nurture student and staff emotional wellbeing and assist students to develop knowledge, understandings and skills that support learning, positive behaviour and constructive social relationships.
- Spiritual Support. Provide an enhanced dimension to the school's care, guidance and support of students' and staff spiritual wellbeing that respects diversity and facilitates their quest for meaning, purpose and hope.
- School Engagement. Provide further social emotional or spiritual support, especially for those students at risk of disengaging, through personal support and/or group activities e.g. clubs, social skills programs, grief & loss courses, etc.
- Community Engagement. Develop the links between the school and its community, working with school-based support staff, community-based youth organisations, churches, agencies, services, and other networks.
- Extra-Curricular Contribution. Participate in and contribute to general school activities, e.g. camps, excursions sports day, etc.

Qualifications:

As a Pastoral Care Worker, I am required to have a Certificate IV in Pastoral Care and undertake additional professional development training each year. I am also a qualified counsellor with a Master's Degree in Counselling. While the role is not that of a counsellor and I am not required to have counselling qualifications, the skills have been very handy.
