FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome back! We hope that children and families were able to find time for a break and some enjoyment during the recent school holidays. It has been great to welcome our young people back to school seeing them rested and ready for an exciting term ahead.

We have some terrific after school parent information sessions early this term. These include Parent Association funded family sessions for 'Where did we come from?' and 'What's happening to us?' next Thursday evening. The following week our Education Committee is hosting their next parent information night with a focus on 'Our Language of learning' at Belair PS and ways to use this language at home to support your children. You will find further information on these events in this newsletter.

PUPIL FREE DAY

On Monday teachers and school service officers participated in a day of training and development aligned to teacher work and the goals of our school site improvement plan. The morning was dedicated to further exploring ways to develop students as learning resources for each other and their student agency. Between morning tea and lunchtime staff collated student information for the mandated Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on school students with a disability. After lunch all staff participated in a workshop around understanding and supporting diversity within our learning community.

MOBILE DEVICES

The change in our school mobile device policy from this week is the inclusion of personal devices which includes smartwatches.

For the purposes of our policy, personal devices include mobile phones, smart watches and other digital devices that are capable of sending or receiving messages or calls and/or able to connect to the internet, and personal laptops or iPads that are not owned by the school and have not been brought to school by the student under our Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) program.

Students are not be able to access their personal devices at any time during school hours, unless they have received an approved exemption from the school to use the device for a specific, agreed reason. This means both physical access and remote access (e.g. connecting with the personal device via hotspot or using paired headphones).

Students need to turn their devices off or place them in flight mode before putting them away. This includes taking off and storing any wearable technology that fits the definition of this policy, such as smartwatches. Students are then required to store their devices in their school bags and not access until the end of the school day.

This is a good time for all families to query the need and purpose of any devices that will need to be stored in school bags during the school day.





NAPLAN

Year 3 and Year 5 NAPLAN results will be sent home to families on Monday 7th August, week 3. This year there have been changes to the reporting of student progress in NAPLAN. Your child's NAPLAN report will show how your child is tracking against the new four levels of achievement known as proficiency standards.

The proficiency standards are:

- Exceeding: the student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.
- **Strong**: the student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.
- Developing: the student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.
- Needs additional support: the student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.

Therefore, "If your child is in the Strong or Exceeding category, it means they have demonstrated proficiency and that their literacy or numeracy skills are where they should be at this stage of their schooling. If your child has not yet achieved proficiency, then they will either be in the Developing category or the Needs additional support category." (ACARA CEO, David de Carvalho)

When you read your child's report, please take the time to celebrate the success that you see and/or identify areas for improvement. If your child is concerned with their results, remind them that NAPLAN isn't a pass or fail test and there are no rewards or penalties for the result your child achieves. Rather, their report is a point in time snapshot of their achievements in the important areas of literacy and numeracy and their results will help teachers to provide additional support in their learning.

SEMESTER 1 REPORTS

Semester 1 student reports went home at the end of last term. If for some reason you have not received your child's report please make contact with the school as soon as possible.

I have just ticked over 20 years as the Pastoral Care Worker at Belair Primary School and I have loved every minute of it! I get to work with intelligent, committed and compassionate people. The staff at Belair are outstanding. But, the best bit is working with the kids. I love how kids think and how they see the world. It keeps me young. I don't know if it will keep me young enough to last another 20 years, but you never know! Here is a reminder of what I do at Belair.

As the Pastoral Care Worker, I'm here as a resource to staff, students and parents. My role is to:

- Provide social and emotional support to students, carers and staff.
- Be a role model and mentor for students.
- Support students in school engagement.
- Be available to students, parents and staff as a listener and support person.
- Provide information regarding resources and agencies available to assist families.
- Work with others in the school and its community to develop services, programs and strategies that meet the needs of children and families at our school.
- Be a resource for staff, students and parents regarding spiritual matters and questions. Please note that this is only if requested. It is not my role to promote any particular religious belief. However, when requested by parents, this is something I can provide and is inclusive of all religious beliefs. While this aspect of the role may not be important to everyone, it is very valuable to a number of families in our community.

Qualifications: Pastoral Care Workers are required to have a Certificate IV in Pastoral Care and undertake additional professional development training each year. I am also a qualified counsellor with a Master's Degree in Counselling. While the role is not that of a counsellor and I am not required to have counselling qualifications, the skills have been very handy.



THE LANGUAGE OF LEARNING


